A Gottle a' Geer

Whether they're billed as a comedic partnership, characters in a soap opera or sitcom, or even a duo of television presenters, they all work in the same way with the same strict formula; the stooge and the straight man.

popular in the Victorian music halls, and hit their peak in 1920s vaudeville, but since the beginning of television and still today they are a staple of light entertainment, especially on the Saturday evening prime time slot. I'm talking about double-acts.

Whether they are billed as a comedic partnership, characters in a soap opera or sitcom, or even a duo of television presenters, they all work in the same way with the same strict formula; the stooge and the straight man. It's the way it has to be; for it to work there has to be a serious one and a funny one. The intellect and the idiot. Even Shakespeare made use of double acts, and not only in his comedies but even in his tragedies; Lear had his fool, Romeo had Mercutio, and Prospero had Caliban.

Either way, the straight man can only be funny if he has his idiot to berate, and the clown can only appear to be stupid if there is the no-nonsense presence of his foil. In modern television it is not always clear which one is which, and after each pair of phrasings they may swap over and reverse their roles; such is the case of Ant and Dec, where it is difficult to tell which one of them is really the most ridiculous out of the two. Double acts are a comedic certainty, but they do not only exist in television-land. Oh no; they are in our homes as well. They are our own relationships. And equally for those whose lifestyles are coloured in an alternative hue, even in the situation of a ménage a trois, it is still there, only

now it is formed by two separate and sometimes warring double acts.

As a boy, which is a past reality that seems like so many years longer ago than it actually is, my favourite kind of comedy duo came in the guise of the ventriloquist act. Technically only one performer; one person, and one puppet friend, but two opposing characters all the same. And to me they were real; both characters, these two opposing personalities, they were both completely alive. I knew that one of them wasn't actually living; that it was some kind of performed manifestation of the ventriloquist. A creation born entirely out of the puppeteer's mind. And yet their relationship, even with some of the lesser quality acts where lips were seen quite obviously to move, even then the forces of their association which held them together and at the same time made them repellent to each other, was all so believable; and in a child's eyes completely paralleled what could be seen every day at home and in the outside

Because it was the same, and is the same. In all marriages, relationships, long-term or short-term, heterosexual or same-sex, there exists always the ventriloquist and his, or her, dummy. There is always a hand up somebody's back, doing all of the controlling and all of the talking. That is not to say that there is something destructive in this, but only that it seems to be the way of things without anyone ever requiring the need to think about it or analyze its reasoning.

But which one is which? Is there always one person as the performer and one as the puppet? Perhaps in very definitely controlled relationships, where one party demands the dominant role and bullies the other into submission. but I do not think that this is generally the case. I believe there is an organic fluidity to the whole aspect of control, and there is a constant unspoken dialogue going on all of the time, in all interactions, where dominance and submission is passed constantly like the ball in some prepubescent game between one another; neither person being entirely comfortable with either role for very long.

It makes me wonder that people don't just claim their own divided personality of authority and obedience so that we never have to bow to anyone else's will, or bend anybody else to ours. But, then again, I don't think any one of us would be entirely comfortable with that situation either. If we were; if each person alone held onto both of their aspects and kept them checked and in a balance, then we would be completely whole, as one piece, and probably without the need for intimate relationships at all. Maybe then we could do away with all interaction with our fellow man altogether; whoever he or she may be, and whatever their connection to us is. What would happen if that should be the case? Quite simply, the world would be very quiet, and very dull, and perhaps for better or worse in a silent, sterile universe we would lose the sense of a need to survive and to shed new seed to carry on our species. How depressing! We would just die out altogether; a forever forgotten race of

lonely individuals not worth the effort of lamenting by any alien race that may come across our solitary histories.

Fortunately our constantly warring aspects remain preeminent. There are times, many times in fact, when we fight to be the one who sets the way things are going to be, the one who selfishly gets his or her own way, often not thinking or caring what our counterpart might want. Because whether we like it or not, the self is often a fraction of the human condition that wins out.

Sometimes though, when a decision comes along that we don't want the responsibility of making, because the wrong turn could result in disaster, or because either way the road will be fraught with obstacles, we are happy then to be the dummy, nodding and shaking its wooden head, mouthing our words but comfortable in the knowledge that those words are not ours and the responsibility will not lay heavy on our shoulders, but will be borne by the one who has their arm pushed up into our body cavity and who will fold us up into a suitcase and walk away with us when the act is finished and the people have applauded.

fingers are operating the puppeteer? Partnerships sometimes break down, and then what happens to the double act? Often the double act dies along with the relationship. But not always. There are some acts that are just too big, where the entire public identity of each party is tied up so completely in the act, that the ending of it would mean a freefall into obscurity for one or both performers. And when the act is more important that the individual, then the act stays even if the marriage is long dead.



This has been the case all through history. Alexander the Great and his wife, Edward the Second and his, and even the composer Cole Porter and his wife Linda Lee Thomas. In these cases the cause of the rift has been sexuality. Each of these men were gay, in a world where the term did not exist and where convention demanded that a heterosexual marriage take place regardless of male homosexuality. In each case the outcome was similar; the female part of the couple is left bereft of thing. Other couples, political double acts such as Bill and Hilary Clinton, and

by personal infidelities with so many fragments having fallen away that the foundations are left with no more solidity than guicksand. And still they walk arm in arm in public view; not because of a love that holds them together, but because they need each other. To remain where they are, in the lifestyles they have worked so hard for, and to progress further still in their careers and remain in the public interest, it is imperative that they do not let go of each other even for a second. Who knows if there are feelings left between them, or even if they have been able to continue as friends? That is not important; it is the act, each with a hand up the other one's back, that holds them together now.

Power struggles and ventriloquism, often in the minute and subconscious, seem to be the way that relationships work whether we like it that way or not. As long as we can still be equal, still be equivalent though we are not the same, then what does it matter? It is the relationship, and the fact that we have them at all, that is important.

And I for one really don't mind having a hand up my back every now and then, tugging at my controls; just as long as that hand also scratches the itch on my shoulder blade, the one that I can never reach, at those times when I need it scratched.

Transport and Technical Services ("TTS") revealed last month that a new road surface, laid recently on Victoria Avenue, was not up to standard and would have to be replaced.

The first phase of the £2.3m works began back in 2008. The Avenue is arguably the most important stretch of road in Jersey, and any delay or error is likely to generate commuter fury.

Road works are an easy target for public dissastisfaction. An atmosphere of discontent is never too far from a set of temporary traffic lights.

The degree to which Islanders complain about public service alterations seems to serve as a barometer for how the wider electorate regard the performance of those in power. When taxpayers spend an inordinate amount of time whinging about people in hivis jackets, it's usually not long before States members begin to attract criticism.

TTS assured that it would make the amends at night, and at no extra cost to the taxpayer.

The baneful game: football's potty-mouthed participants

The Jersey Football Association may face a shortage of volunteers to referee its fixtures in the future. Some officials believe the dearth in support is due to the amount of dissent referees and their assistants receive from players and coaching staff.

Foul language, from the sidelines in particular, may be starker in a local Sunday league match than when watching a Premiership game on Sky Sports. Of course, when a crowd is in full swing, it's hard to ignore a chant of "the referee's a w***er" through the TV set. However, individual outbursts are a different kettle of fish. If one fan flips out during a televised match it is usually drowned out by the other 20,000 feckless idiots all claiming to be José Mourinho, and is just a primordial drone. (In that sense, it's a bit like the cast of Planet of the Apes auditioning for Last Choir Standing; those making the noise and scratching their arses are all dressed the same but they don't make the slightest bit of sense.)

plant food takes root in Jersey's night club scene



Coniters. They're mad for it.

Health experts in Jersey are concerned that increasing numbers of night clubbers are taking plant food as a cheaper alternative to ecstasy. Mephedrone, or 'miaow', is illegal here but the authorities are debating whether to upgrade the substance to class B.

On Monday 15 March 2010, two teenagers in Scunthorpe died after taking the drug.

DrugScope, an independent centre of information on drug use in the UK, says side effects may include insomnia, involuntary muscle clenching and hallucinations. In some cases, it seems, regular or heavy use may develop into psychological dependency.

The JEP has also reported that as many as one third of Guernsey's prison inmates are addicted to the drug.

Initial suspicions were raised when staff noticed that prison inmates were showering several times a day in order to have "a good soak". These suspicions were confirmed last month when guards were forced to dig out the 1st XI football team who had buried themselves up to the shins on the Prison's pitch prior to training.

Retailers reject plans for third supermarket



should local retailers ferme their boucheries? no!

The proposals came to light last month after an Economic Development Department ("EDD") report was leaked to the public. Unsurprisingly, some existing retailers are up in arms. Turkeys don't vote for Christmas.

Some arguing against the move have raised concerns about planning issues, as well as the effect that a third player would have at a time of economic downturn and difficult trading conditions. Those in favour of the move trust that the theory that additional competition would lead to reduced prices would become reality.

Some sceptics believe the effects of the newbie supermarket may be positive for a time, but that it would ultimately raise its prices in line with its competitors - once it works out what the more affluent section of Jersey's society is willing to pay.

EDD has, in the past, supported the campaign for Islanders to 'buy local'. Such campaigns are designed to encourage Islanders to make the pounds they spend go further in the local economy. Arguably, some farm shops have succeeded in staking a claim in the marketplace. Would a third supermarket blow this progress out of the water? Time will tell.

Crash caused by driver shaving bikini line

A car crash in Florida is being blamed on the fact that the driver was attempting to shave her bikini line at the wheel. Trooper Gary Dunick says the 37-year-old woman was attempting to shave her pubic hair, while her ex-husband held the wheel. Her car then crashed into the back of a pickup truck, injuring two women, reports the Key West Citizen. "She said she was meeting her boyfriend in Key West and wanted to be ready for the visit," Trooper Dunick said.

Two female passengers in the pickup truck were treated for minor injuries following the crash in Cudjoe Key. To make matters worse, police said the woman motorist has been banned from driving for five years the day before the crash for driving under the influence. She now faces charges of driving with a revoked license, reckless driving, driving with no insurance, and of leaving the scene of a wreck with injuries.



Man stole ambulance and patient

A US man has been arrested - after he stole an ambulance with a patient and paramedics still inside it. Nicholas Pontillo, 24, of Lake Villa, Illinois, took the vehicle for a joyride while drunk, according to police. Pontillo alledgedly slipped into the cab while paramedics were treating a teenager with an injured knee in the back. However, he didn't get very far - the vehicle's emergency brake was on so he ended up driving it around the car park, before eventually being arrested by sheriff's deputies. Dane County emergency management specialist Carrie Meier said the theft attempt may have been thwarted because the paramedics had followed procedure. "They had the emergency brake on. That's one thing we always do for safety reasons," she said. Pontillo has been charged with vehicle theft and may also face a charge of drink driving.

Why a bigger bum is good for you

Having a bigger bum, hips and thighs can be good for your health, protecting against heart problems, according to scientists. Carrying fat around the backside and thighs reduces the effect of harmful proteins which cause inflammation and artery clogging, they claim. The researchers found that a larger rear is preferable to extra fat around the stomach which gives no such protection, reports the Daily Mail (I know). Gluteofemoral fat around the lower body is harder to break down than upper body fat around the stomach which is designed to be quickly generated and then easily metabolised. But

the breakdown of these fat cells releases a lot of pro-inflammatory cytokines which have been linked to cardiovascular disease, insulin resistance and diabetes. Slower-burning hip fat also makes more of a hormone that protects the arteries and promotes better blood sugar control and fat burning.


'Prune' your social interactions







This brilliant piece of legislation was introduced in South Carolina during the 1950s, when there was a Red under every







exhibition of the month

Discover Jersey

Bryony Koester



Bryony Koester's first solo exhibition 'Discover Jersey' aims to ask the Jersey public what it is that creates our cultural identity and how can we preserve it in a fast moving world? An exhibition that asks the audience to participate in considering our island's heritage as well asking you to respond to the work.

Bryony's research into the island - her home - stemmed from her leaving Jersey to study a fine art degree in Brighton. It was then that Bryony began to question her relationship to her home and the rest of the world.

Offering a portrait into Jersey's unique and complex identity - both past and present, 'Discover Jersey' will be divided into two parts. Firstly, a collection of miniature tableaux which make up a portrait of the island; deconstructing it into individual aspects of Jersey's history, traditions and heritage. The work will be presented in jars in such a way that provides a vantage point to view the island as a whole.

Those visiting the Sir John Cheshire Gallery will have the opportunity to respond to the exhibition on post cards in the downstairs area of the gallery, and those who wish to have further contact with the artist can leave their details. These audience reponses will form the basis of the second part of the exhibition which will be presented at Bryony's degree show at her University in May.

Bryony chose to exhibit work towards her degree within the island so that

'Discover Jersey' could be shown in the right context; with its appropriate audience. It's an exciting exhibition that not only allows us to have an insight into the work that students undergo at degree level but also a subject that affects us all, that we can respond to.

Bryony hopes that the exhibition will encourage her audience to address questions, such as:
Where is Jersey's placement within the modern external world?

Can the island continue its modernisation yet still retain its identity? How important is island identity today?

Interested in the content of the feedback, Bryony's exhibition and research will give both herself and others an insight into how much and why islanders value their home. Bryony talks about her driving force for the work:

"I would like to see Jersey preserve its traditions and its heritage, because it is unique, but I do believe that there is a tendency to undervalue the island, and unless this is brought to people's attention, it could be lost forever."



Turn for the better? Karen Le Roy Harris



I often find people using the term 'modern art' in a derogatory way (often when referring to contemporary, not modern work). I wonder what impact hype in the media and famous awards such as the Turner Prize have on those judging the current art world. Previous 2001 Turner Prize winner Martin Creed caused controversy with his 'Lights going on and off' installation with an empty room doing just so. People wondered whether this could even be considered art. But still the work did raise questions and spark opinions/conversation, which is what art should be doing, right? However, as much as I think there is place for this, I was really happy to see the latest Turner Prize being awarded to Richard Wright; someone with both conceptual, technical and aesthetic merit. It's important to me that this is recognised. Looking at my peers, I know some tremendous drawers, painters, sculptors, printers; all of which heavily rely on a very skilled technical process they have developed. So it was good to see this being reflected with a positive outlook embracing our skills as artists. However, lets not forgot artwork should also challenge and we should be looking for work that provokes something in you not merely a decorative commodity.



Kick Ass tells the story of Dave Lizewski (Aaron Johnson) - a normal kid who dons a pair of tights and takes to the streets to fight crime. The twist beyond the usual comic's fare is that this isn't a world where radioactivity is going to grant you super powers. Instead it's more likely to give you cancer. Case in point Lizewski aka Kick Ass's first attempt to fight crime ends with him in hospital. This doesn't stop our hero and after becoming a You Tube sensation finds himself teaming with other 'heroes' including Red Mist (Christopher Mintz-Plasse) Big Daddy (Nicolas Cage) and his foul-mouthed twelve year-old daughter Hit Girl to take down a local drug baron.

It's certainly a unique concept taking the fantastical costumed hero into the real world. Lizewski is inspired by the comic heroes of our world but isn't prepared for the violent consequences that vigilantism brings. In this respect the film doesn't embrace the cliches of the comic book genre but actively rebels against them. For example the girl of his dreams initially views him as a weird stalker before a series of events leads to her believing him to be a gay prostitute. The narrative delights in these wild subversions and hopefully the film can capture this playfulness. The comic book is also ultra violent with the trailer promising Kill Bill levels of blood flow. This is in every way a film pitched at an adult audience. There certainly won't be any Kick-Ass Happy Meal Toys. 300 and Sin City are kind of role models for this movie's performance. They also may have played a large role in its genesis.

Kick Ass was created by Mark Millar and John Romita Jnr, two of the most prominent and successful of today's comic creators. Millar, also the writer of Wanted, is so well respected that both Wanted and Kick Ass were sold as movie properties before the first issue of either series was released. His work on The Ultimates is currently acting as a template for Marvel's current slate of movie releases including 2012's highly anticipated Avengers movie teaming up Iron Man, Hulk, Thor and Captain America. He is massively involved in Kick Ass acting as a producer and adviser to director Matt Vaughn and writer Jane Goldman who are no strangers to comic book adaptations having worked together adapting Neil Gaiman's Stardust. This level of involvement has in the past only had good results. Fidelity to the spirit of the text turned Frank Miller's Sin City and 300 into breakout hits. Respect for the crazy, fun, action-packed Kick Ass comic book I'm sure will produce a crazy, fun, action-packed film.



The track radiates with an aura that seems reserved solely for summer and Shyvonne's vocal refrain comes with a 3 days stuck-in-your-head or your money back guarantee.

Speechless Single - Out now

Breakage ft. Donaeo

"Epic." That was the word used to describe Breakage's "Speechless" after it's first ever radio airing, however the reality is that "Speechless" is anything but. As far as dustup goes "Speechless" is extraordinarily pedestrian, pushing the already slow tempo of the genre down even further. The track's drop is tame to say say the least, Donaeo's vocals grate and don't even get me started on the guitar solo at the end.

Foals Spanish Sahara Single - Out Now

I don't think it's any exaggeration to say that Foals are one of the best bands Britain has to offer at the moment. On "Spanish Sahara", the Oxford quintet ditch the angular, jerky guitars for a much more expansive sound that the band has hinted at being capable of in the past. Coming in at just under 7 minutes, "Spanish Sahara" is an atmospheric epic with hair raising crescendos stemming from a steady build up of subtle synth lines and reverberating guitars that leaves you wondering why Foals are one of only a few UK bands willing to take real risks.

MGMT Flash Delirium Single-April 11th

I wanted to like this song, I really did, but unfortunately it was just never going to happen. With the likes of "Kids", "Electric Feel" and "Time To Pretend" they wowed us all, yet now comes new single "Flash Delirium" which sounds like the band has tried to take ideas for 5 different songs, mesh them all up together and hope for the best. The familiar spaced out vocals are present, a stale portion of chanting rears it's head but special mention goes to the flute cameo. Who knew you could make a song this cluttered.

Drake

Over

Single - Out Now

If you were wondering why Drake is essentially nailed on as the next big Hip Hop superstar then look no further than his new single "Over". Lyrically Drake is much less of your stereotypical macho-rapper and on "Over" he showcases his style which is much more Kanye than Lil' Wayne. On top of a royal entrance of horn and strings Drake deals with the anxiety that surrounds instant fame with an almost funny sense of nonchalance. "I really can't complain, everything's kosher/ Two thumbs up, Ebert and Roeper", and with punchlines like Drake's it's hard not to like him.

Jamie Foxx Night Like This Single - Out Now

Congratulations Jamie Foxx, for making what can only be described as a 3 minutes of creative void, an abyss of musical imagination. "Night Like This" is akin to popping a sleeping pill, lulling you to sleep with it's singular beat that stays rigid throughout. Ancient tradition thought it was unlucky to marry in the month of May because in Romans times the Feast of the Dead and the Festival of the Goddess of Chastity both occurred in May.

It is believed to be bad luck for the bride to make her own wedding dress.

The kiss that is given by the bride to the groom at the end of the wedding ceremony originates from the earliest times when the couple would actually make love for the first time under the eyes of half the village.




Origami



Elizabeth Castle

Elizabeth Castle in St Aubin's Bay defended the Island from attack for 300 years. Civil wedding ceremonies are held in the Governor's House, which was built in the 1590s. Since the summer is coming we were lucky enough to get an interview with Mr Sudip Ray who is a Consultant Vascular Surgeon in London with a particular interest in keyhole treatment of varicose veins. He consults at Parkside Hospital in Wimbledon as well as locally in Jersey. Varicose veins are unsightly, common and easliy dealt with. We find out more:

WHAT ARE VARICOSE VEINS?

Varicose veins are easily recognised as bluish worm-like cords around the thigh, knee and calf. They are essentially surface veins that have become baggy or dilated, and are often easier to see towards the end of the day but disappear when the legs are raised in bed or on a stool. They are found in around 20% of the population and are a common source of worry and medical consultation

WHAT CAUSES VARICOSE VEINS?

Varicose veins are usually associated with faulty valves within the drainage system of the leg. These valves normally ensure that flow is maintained up the leg against gravity, but when they start to fail the surface veins can be put under pressure and start to enlarge into varicosities. They are more common during and following pregnancies due to the pressure of the baby in the pelvis as well as hormonal changes which relax the vein walls. There may also be a genetic predisposition explaining why

varicose veins sometimes "run in the family".

ARE VARICOSE VEINS HARMFUL?

Although varicose veins are sometimes of cosmetic concern, they may cause discomfort and aching or feelings of heaviness, especially towards the end of the day or during periods. Occasionally the veins become thrombosed ("phlebitis") or itch and bleed. In the longer term, if severe and untreated, they may contribute to the development of permanent skin changes such as pigmentation, eczema or even ulceration. They do not cause deep vein thrombosis, either after long flights or journeys.

HOW DOES ONE KNOW IF THERE IS AN UNDERLYING VALVE PROBLEM CAUSING THE VARICOSE VEINS?

The anatomy and function of leg veins can be determined by a simple, safe and painless ultrasound examination which takes around 20 minutes. A specialist may also perform venous refilling tests which give additional information about the severity of the condition.

HOW CAN VARICOSE VEINS BE TREATED?

For symptoms such as aching or heaviness some patients may gain relief by wearing elastic support stockings obtained from the local chemist. However if the veins are particularly large or visible then surgical intervention may be required. More recently "keyhole" techniques are now available, the most popular of which is radiofrequency (VNUS) closure of the veins, as shown over there to the right.



Here a 2mm tube is inserted into the faulty vein under local anaesthetic and the vein is internally heated to 120 degrees C by high frequency ultrasound waves. This obliterates the vein without having to remove it and only requires a tiny incision so the patient can literally walk out following the treatment.

WHAT IS THE ROLE OF INJECTIONS (SCLEROTHERAPY) IN VARICOSE VEINS?

Sclerotherapy is a treatment involving the injection of a small

amount of liquid detergent into varicose veins with the intention of causing an inflammatory reaction which results in closure of the vein. This can be successful for smaller sized varicose veins and for more cosmetic thread or flare veins often seen around the thighs or ankles (microsclerotherapy). A bandage is usually required for a week but the patient can continue normal activities immediately and improvement usually seen by six weeks. Mixing the solution with air ("foam") produces a more powerful solution but can lead to darkening of the overlying skin.

Crab Mayonnaise with Jersey Royals and Asparagus (Serves 4)

For this tasty and simple seasonal recipe, I recommend you get your crab meat from big Louis Jackson at the Fresh Fish Company on Victoria Pier, you'll not find better, trust me!

Make sure the crab meat is free from any small pieces of shell, then put it in the fridge. Next put half the lemon juice, a pinch of salt, the butter and the mint in a good pan with the Jersey Royals and cover with water. Gently simmer until just cooked and place to one side, leaving them in the water to take on the flavour of the mint.

Place a separate pan of lightly salted water on to blanch the asparagus spears. While that's coming to the boil, make the mayonnaise. In a bowl, vigorously whisk the eggs with two tablespoons of vinegar and one teaspoon of mustard until the mixture turns pale. Slowly add the vegetable oil in a steady stream whisking all the time. (It's a good idea to grab someone to help you at this point just to hold the bowl while you give it a damn good thrashing). As you slowly add the oil the consistency will thicken, when you reach the stage where the mayonnaise stays on the whisk when held in the air it's finished. Add three drops of Tabasco, salt to taste, and a

dash of lemon juice, then put in the tarragon, parsley and chives and give the mix a good stir. Add the carefully picked crab and stir again making sure the mayonnaise and crab are well combined but not mushy.


Cook your asparagus for two minutes and remove. Then place a nice big spoonful of the crab mayonnaise in the centre of your favourite dinner plates, remove the perfectly cooked Jersey Royals from the water and drain. Smear a little butter on the asparagus spears and season with Maldon sea salt, then sit them on top of the crab, top with fresh rocket leaves and serve the buttered potatoes in a side dish, and bingo, there you have it. A great way to experience some of Jersey's best local and seasonal produce in one simple dish that you can eat anytime, anywhere.

All you need is some fantastic cabbage leaf bread from Vienna Bakery and some salted butter, and the meal is complete. Oh and don't forget a good glass of crispy white wine to round it off!



space: the final frontier

It's hard to find a plot or property with space in Jersey. We went to look at a place with potential



What's hiding in your attic?

We all have old toys hiding somewhere in our houses, but what many of us don't realise is that some of these seemingly innocuous items can hold great secrets, and great value. 
But be warned, condition has become increasingly important in recent years, particularly as a result of eBay releasing large quantities of stock onto the market in a short period.



Co-operative and Social Responsibility

In the first of a new series focusing on corporate and social responsibility, Gallery lifts the lid on local companies to find out what they're giving back to the community.



inner of the Jersey Electricity Company Environmental Award at this year's Jersey Enterprise Awards, the Channel Islands Cooperative has proved it's not just a supermarket chain. Gallery went to meet the Co-operative's Chief Executive, Jim Hopley to find out

So Jim, tell us something people don't know about the Channel Islands Co-operative.

We're a locally-owned, locally-controlled independent business. We're not a branch or a subsidiary of a UK operation. We're completely local and we like to think of ourselves as very close to the local community.

Where do you stand on Fairtrade?

The Co-operative in the UK was the first major food retailer to start introducing Fairtrade products back in the mid-90s and we now stock over 200 Fairtrade products in our stores, everything from wine and fruit to cosmetic products. It's not just tea, coffee and chocolate.

Is it really making a difference?

Yes. For example, take the changes that the big chocolate manufacturers are having to make. Thanks to organizations like Stop the Traffik, we're becoming aware that much of the cocoa bean picking in the cocoa farms of Ivory Coast, West Africa is done by thousands of young children who have been trafficked, sold into slavery to harvest the cocoa that makes over a third of the world's chocolate.

So our Easter eggs could be produced by child slave labour?

If they're not Fairtrade, then maybe. More money is made from people trafficking currently than drug dealing, which is an amazing statistic. But with Fairtrade and Stop the Traffik putting pressure on the

big chocolate multinationals, many of them are starting to make their chocolate Fairtrade. Our Co-operative brand block chocolate has been Fairtrade for many years, and even in these hard economic times, sales of Fairtrade products are holding up well. It's all about changing people's habits.

Tell us about your recent water initiative.

For every bottle of Co-operative Fairbourne water we sell, 5p is donated to The One Foundation, which uses the cash to buy specially crafted children's roundabouts to use as water pumps for communities in Africa. As the children play on the roundabout, fresh clean water is pumped from deep underground boreholes into a storage tank that can be used by the whole village. There are about a million people in Africa now who've got fresh water as a result of that initiative.

And what about local initiatives?

As an organization we've always supported local producers, and we work closely with Genuine Jersey and local growers to source food in-island wherever possible rather than importing it. All our poultry products are produced to a higher welfare standard than they've ever been before, and our fresh fish from the fish counter is sourced from sustainable stocks as far as possible. Our Cooperative brand toiletries and cosmetics haven't been tested on animals.

And you've just won an environment award, so you must be environmentallyfriendly as well?

We've always tried to take the environment into consideration, but we wanted to reduce our carbon footprint. With energy-saving measures, we managed to reduce our energy consumption in all our stores by 15%. And we've just introduced a new piece of technological kit in our Beaumont store that cuts our energy consumption by another 14%. We're just in the process

of rolling it out to all our stores, so very soon we'll be close to a 30% reduction in energy consumption. As well as that, our fleet of delivery goods vehicles run on biodiesel that's been refined from commercial cooking oil, and the waste cardboard our stores produce gets turned into animal bedding.

That's impressive! But what the Co-operative's probably best known for is the 'Bag for Life' scheme.

We really took an opportunity there to change people's habits. Last year we would have given away close to 15 million of those one-trip carrier bags across the two islands. But by charging 5p for them, we actually sold only 400,000. We promised to use all that revenue for environmental causes.

So the 5p we pay for carrier bags goes to charity?

Not only all those 5ps, but also all the money we've saved as a company from not having to give away 15 million carrier bags. It's all gone into an environmental fund which has generated a total of £200,000 so far, most of which we've already used to fund a vast array of projects, from supporting Durrell to providing ponds and quiet areas for island schools. We've not only supported charities, we've also tried to raise the profile of environmental issues by funding special film screenings, and bringing experts over like Patrick Holden, director of the Soil Association who visited recently to talk about food security.

Why is the Co-operative getting involved in all these initiatives?

It's very simple. We do it because we believe it's the right thing to do. And we believe our customers and members want to do it too. We're finding that much of what we're doing actually makes sound commercial sense as well. Not only is it the right thing to do, it's also the sensible thing to do.

What made you choose the company you work for?

I was fortunate enough during my university days to obtain work experience with a variety of firms in the financial sector. In addition, make sure that you pick a firm and profession that you feel comfortable in as the worst thing to do is to rush a decision and realise that it was the wrong one. This can be done by looking at the companies' websites, going to their open evenings or better still doing some work experience if that is a possibility.

What made you choose the company you work for?

Returning to Jersey after having finished university, the obvious choice for me was to look for a career in the finance industry. As part of my degree I had chosen to take a placement year working in a local accountancy firm. 




I'm fully aware that the cost of living in Jersey is higher than that of most parts of the UK and that car imports are subject to reregistration and GST but if you're buying a fairly new vehicle like any of the ones on this page they'll all come with road tax and an MOT where applicable. What does this mean for you? It means you can claim a refund on the road tax which should easily cover the cost of re-registration and inspection locally and that there shouldn't be any major faults with your new acquisition. Factor in the cost of a flight out and boat back and you're still onto a winner – why not spend the weekend somewhere nice in the UK or even

come back via France and have a little break whilst you're at it?

£4000

Okay, so there wasn't a huge saving to be made on the SLK in this case given the difference in mileage between the two examples but is it only me that thinks 10,000 miles isn't that much? The Bentley, however was not only better specified but also had LESS miles and still came in cheaper than the local example. The Mini too was available to a better level of specification for the sake of only a thousand or so miles and the Honda CRV is essentially exactly the same car but with a £2,500 saving when bought on the mainland. Last, and by absolutely no means least, the biggest saving to be had was on the Freelander 2, which, for the sake of 369 miles (about a month's commuting over here) you could save a hefty £7,217. So why throw your money away if you don't have to?





When did you start running?

I started at the age of 15, but had a couple of years out through injuries and returned at age 18.

Was there anything that inspired you to start running?

I was always watching martials arts movies as a kid and Muay Thai was the one that interested me the most, as it used all eight limbs, being elbows, knees, shins and fists. I met Peter Dolan through a friend who is one of the trainers at Jersey Thai Boxing Club. He offered to take me up the gym to see what it was like.

Where and when was your favorite boxing

When Harry made his last entrance into the ring and slipped climbing over the top rope and landing on his side rolling into the centre of the ring in front of a 500-strong crowd in Chiang Mai Thailand. On a serious note, my favourite moment was after my first fight in Jersey. I was losing badly on the first round due to nerves and over-enthusiaism. I was thrown through the ropes ending up on the other side, questioning where I was and what I was doing. The bell went and i returned to my corner, where my trainer Rob Mitchell said the simple words "Calm down". The second round bell went, I took a deep breath and turned the fight completely around by picking my shots off, landing clean blows, instead of wasting energy hitting thin air. By the third round, I completely composed myself thinking more clearly about what i had to do to win the fight and did so by TKO (Technical Knock out) in the third round. This was at Fort Regent with a 1000-strong crowd. The main reason this was my best moment was because of the feeling I got from all my friends and the crowd cheering me on, a feeling of euphoria I had never experienced before, which lasted for weeks after. An extra big special thanks to Michael Nicholson my number one fan!

What is your worst Thai Boxing accident?

Touch wood, I have been lucky so far, my worst accident was a fractured foot I received

in my last fight in Jersey against Danny Kendrick, I broke it in the 2nd round and bit through the pain to win the fight on points.


Obviously it's a brutal sport, what's the worst injury you've seen?

In Thailand I witnessed a Thai boxer get his fore-arm broken with a kick. Sounds quite brutal but I have witnessed hundreds of fights and this was the worst injury i've seen with my own eyes, to be honest I think you are more likely to get a broken bone playing in a football match.

Southpaw fighters like myself and are considered the best fighters to this date at their weights. Not only that but their style and the way they win their fights is much more technical and beautiful to watch than brute strength hoping on a lucky shot. I met Yodsaenklai recently and have never met a more humble man.

How do you prepare for a big match?

The first thing I do is change my diet. I cut out all the rubbish foods (yes even KFC!) like cakes and cheeseburgers (my favourite food) and do not drink any alchohol from 6 weeks before the event as this would affect my training and concentration. I try to eat carbs in the mornings (rice, pasta and potatoes) and protein in the evenings (chicken and fish). I make sure I eat pleanty of fruit and vegtables as not only do you need all this to cut weight but it helps to give you energy for all the training we do. Fight Training starts on average 6 weeks before the event. We train 6 times a week, running long distance



but slowly every morning to build up leg muscles and afternoons another light run followed by intense pad training in the gym. This varies with skipping, sit ups, push ups, other toning exercises and sparring. Training varies differently if I am in Thailand as I have a lot more time, due to not working so training becomes longer and more frequent. I feel we get just as fit in Jersey, in the hours we do as I would in Thailand, due to our fitness regime from Rob Mitchell.

Other than the phsyical side, I try to watch videos of my opponent to work out their strengths and weaknesses in order to beat them. The best part of the training is the few days before the fight, as the training becomes a lot lighter and easier so our bodies can recover.

How can you get people Thai boxing in Jersey?

Thai Boxing is a relatively unknown sport in UK and USA unlike boxing. There needs to be more big events and sponsorship, so people can witness the beauty and technicality of the sport. Also its a good way to keep fit and keep youngsters out of trouble, giving them something to aim for in life.

that's Champions League, FA Cup and Premier
League). Whilst some of the credit should go
to the impressive United midfield, Cole and
Yorke possessed the best finishing in the league
and without this, United may have not been so
successful that year.

Serena and Venus Williams
The Williams sisters have been playing
with and against each other since they
were children, and it shows. Each of them has
enjoyed great individual success on the court,
overwhelming their opponents with power and
speed and when they are paired together in
doubles tournaments they dominate.

d Shaq and Kobe (LA Lakers) Sure these two egomaniacal stars detest one another, but during their time together it is hard to argue they were one of the most dominant duos of all time. Kobe's electrifying play, vision on the court and shooting ability perfectly complemented Shaq's dominant play under the basket. This lethal combo left coaches and defenders alike at a loss on who and how to cover these two superstars. 



Wizard & the Frog are Jersey's Grant Healey, Jeremy Kerley, Dom Pallot and Paul Nightingale. Since 2003 they have been favourites on the Jersey scene, with their lively shows that incorporate fancy dress costumes, hilariously uplifting lo-fi folk-pop songs with titles such as 'Home Alone the Musical', 'Sexy Wrestling' and 'Seriousness Belongs in the Bin.' They return to the live fold for their first Jersey show of 2010 at Club Kamikaze in the Live Lounge this month, where they'll be supporting the outrageous London electro DJ/producer, DJ Men in Masks (who is also none other than TV presenter/comedian Jeff Leach.) We caught up with frontman Grant, aka the Wizard, to find out what's in store.

Hello Wizard. You're based in London now - what are you working on at the moment?

Much of my time is spent on tubes and buses, and giving incorrect directions to tourists. When I'm not doing that, I spend a lot of time growing my moustache, and I'm also currently practicing with my new band, called I Was a Teenage D***head. We're a bit like the Ramones, with a female lead singer who does a lot of screaming. Our songs are about being an idiot at school, winding teachers up and generally misbehaving. We're better than at least 12% of all the other bands in the world, and we'll be over in Jersey to rock your souls to your soles in due course.

Who are your biggest influences and inspirations?

Jonathan Richman & the Modern Lovers are a big influence; he writes songs that are funny

and a bit touching, and they're a little bit like Wizard & the Frog without the fancy dress. Some other heroes include Robocop, Lloyd Kaufman, Paul Nightingale, Craig Healey, Karl Payne, Sam Thompson and Elvis Presley. I rip bits off from all of them in every area of my life.

What's the ethos behind Wizard & the Frog?

It's all about being stupid and silly. Our songs are about teaching people the importance of not taking life seriously, unless it's absolutely unavoidable. If more people realised that life is boring unless you act like a complete idiot, then everyone would be much happier. I would anyway. It's also an excuse to dress up as a wizard, and for the Frog to dress up as a frog. Next question please.

What bands did you play in before?

I used to be Elvis J Healey, lead singer of Jonny and the Rats, who were the greatest/worst rockabilly band in the history of rockabilly bands. The kids loved us. I also played guitar for a lo-fi folk band called the Boiling Organs; we had a Bontempi fan organ and a saxophonist who had never played a saxophone before. We played our first gig the day after we'd formed and if I remember rightly, got asked to cut our set short, which was a shame because I thought it was going quite well. After that I was in a grindcore band called How To Tell Yourself From a Television, and then an techno-metal band called Robot Ninja Dinosaur B****rds. We got a record deal and everything, toured around Europe, and then we blew it and now I'm back to square one.

What bands are you excited about currently?

Bands are boring. Ponytail are good though, check them out if you like surf guitar and demented vocal wailing.

When was the last time you played in Jersey?

We played at the very first Club Kamikaze in November, with Midnight Expresso and DJ Emba Djemba. It was a wonderful occasion and I recall that several people puked and fainted with joy. It was party time o'clock.

Describe your live show to those that haven't seen you play?

First, I get my purple cape and wizard's hat on. Next the drumming Frog, trombone-playing Fairy, and the bass-playing Spacemaster accompany me to the stage. As we play songs about Home Alone, sexy wrestling, lobsters, cheese and ham sandwiches and party time, you'll feel a warm sensation spreading over your thighs. That is when you realise you've wet yourself. Then when we leave the stage, you'll shout 'encore!', but we won't oblige until you buy us a drink. Gin and tonic please.

Any final messages for the Jersey audience before you come and play?



bucking the trend?

The three Buckers, two of which are Jersey boys, met accidentally in January 2005 at the unlikely setting of a suburban Buddhist Disco in North London. Being the only three men in attendance with hair on top of their heads, Andy, Dom and Craig found themselves backed into a corner after the disco turned into a sedate chant-fest.

The three lads quickly discovered that they had more than just follicular abundance in common and joined forces at an East London rehearsal studio a week later. Despite none of the band being called Buck or any of them being Brothers, the band claim to have named themselves after an adult film company that Dom once worked for.

Within two months of forming, the boys recorded 'The World According to Buck' which was playlisted on over 400+ college radio stations throughout the United States and Canada with heavy rotation and chart placements aplenty. After tours in Europe and North America, the band recorded their debut album "Me". To commemorate the release date of the first single from the album "Girls, Skirts, Boots, Bikes" in the UK, Buck Brothers successfully achieved a world record entry for 'highest number of gigs performed in 12 hours' in their native London with 28 shows undertaken on 5th March 2007.

Their second album "We Are Merely Filters" is released 5th April 2010.





See Pure in a new light

The Weighbridge has definitely seen some changes over the last few years. When Gallery got to Jersey there was still talk of people 'hiding' in Buses and Oliver Twist's was the place to get a coffee. The owner Martin told us he was fed up with the club being branded 'a grotty, dirty den of iniquity' but did concede that the club has not been updated for a good few years. (Regardless, DJs such as HYBRID, who played in February, maintains that he loves coming to Jersey and playing intimate venues. The footage

filmed on Valentine's night was used in his latest track 'Disappear Here'.) Owner Martin says he's really impressed with the new look.

He told us, 'I spent a lot of time looking into colour and design and then finally everything came together. The venue would not be out of place holding more corporate events in the week. We have done a few but still hold dear to our underground house roots on the weekends. I am pleased with the final product and I am sure you will be too...'
